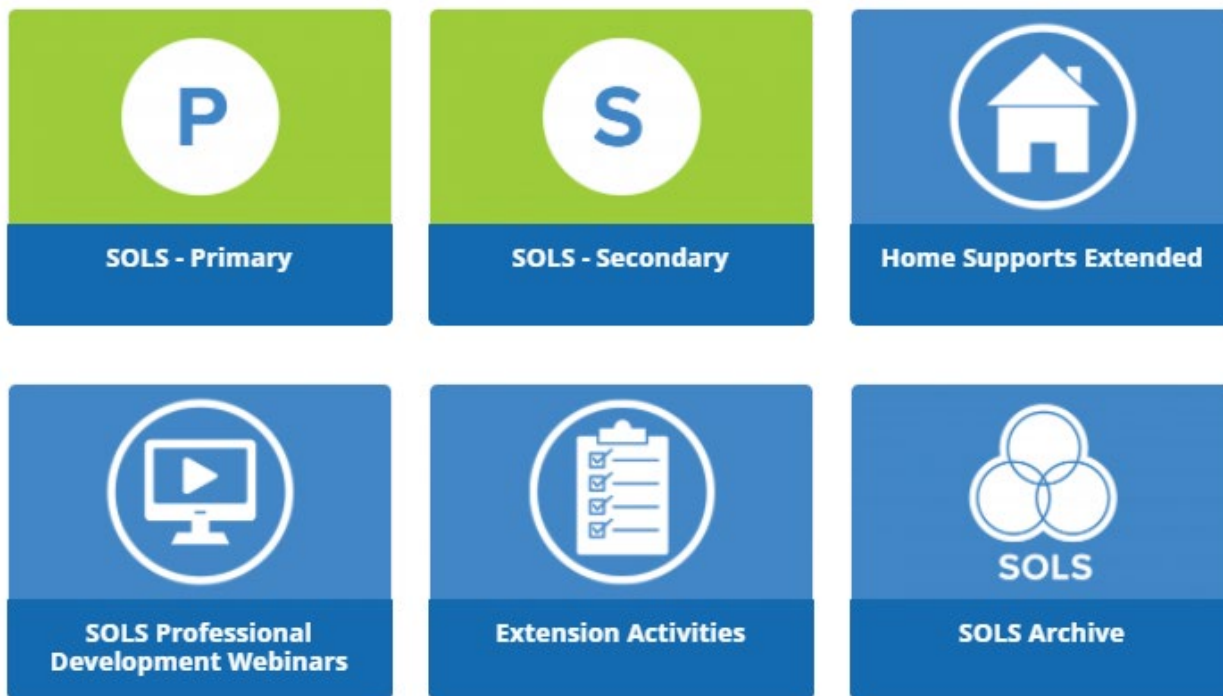
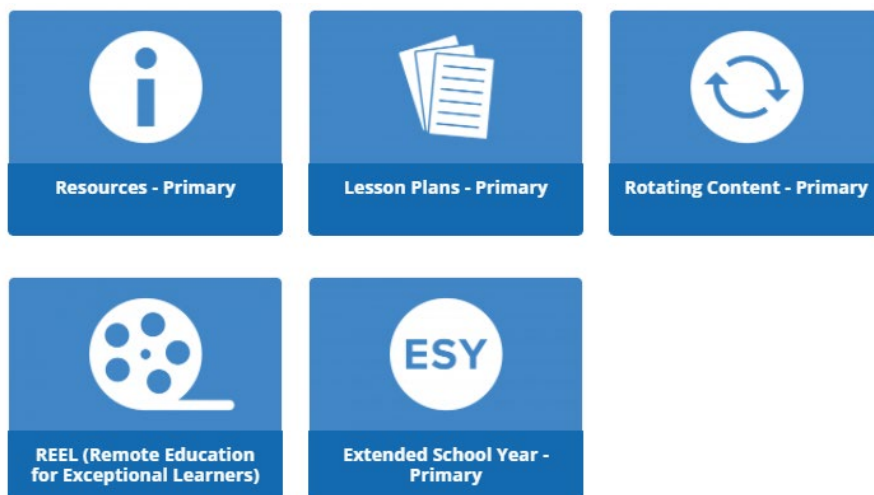


Navigating Through STAR Online Learning System (SOLS)

1. Once you've logged-in to the STAR Media Center and clicked on the STAR Online Learning System (SOLS) box, you can freely navigate through the SOLS system.
2. This is what the main SOLS page looks like. There are important and helpful supports in the Extension Activities, SOLS Professional Development Webinars, Home Supports Extended, (and sometimes in the SOLS Archive), but the place that you will likely want to get started is either SOLS – Primary or SOLS – Secondary:



3. For this example, we will navigate into the SOLS – Primary box (helpful tip: navigating within the SOLS – Primary and SOLS – Secondary boxes is an almost identical experience except for the content of the resources and materials):



4. Within those five boxes, there are many resources to support robust remote learning for students who have a wide range of strengths and needs. Starting with Resources – Primary, let’s explore a few resources that might be most helpful to get started! Shown below is a brief excerpt of the many resources available within the Resources – Primary box. Strand Selection Guide, Skills Assessment, Lesson Sets, IEP Goal Alignment, and Teacher Pre-Session Checklist, all circled in red, are among the resources that might be helpful in getting started with SOLS. Don’t forget to explore the other resources available here, but these five documents are a good starting point:

5. Lesson Plans – Primary is another important place (box) to visit while preparing to teach using SOLS. When you click on Lesson Plans – Primary, you will see four boxes (SOLS - Primary - Strand A, SOLS – Primary – Strand B, SOLS – Primary – Strand C, and SOLS – Primary – Group). For this example, we'll select SOLS – Primary – Strand B (helpful tip: you'll know which box to click to access the appropriate lesson plans based on the Strand Selection Guide for each student). Here, you'll find all the lesson plans necessary to get started:

LESSON PLANS

PRESENTATION

Use the Remote Education for Exceptional Learners (REEL) tool to create individual lesson presentations based on each student's strand and skill level. This remote session builder supports individual student learning targets and IEP goals.

STRAND B GREETING AND ROUTINE LESSON PLANS

The *greeting/circle* lesson plan provides a guide and schedule to offer students a consistent introduction to daily lessons and routines, providing structure and predictability to home-based instruction. Use the functional routine lesson plan to support students in practicing and gaining independence during daily routines.

STRAND B1 TEACHING AND PLAY TIME LESSON PLANS

Play time, functional academic, and language lessons for students working on skills in the B1 sub-strand.

STRAND B2 TEACHING AND PLAY TIME LESSON PLANS

Play time, functional academic, and language lessons for students working on skills in the B2 sub-strand.

6. Finally, after again navigating from the SOLS main page by clicking on the REEL (Remote Education for Exceptional Learners) box, we'll show an example of creating a REEL (that's what the student(s) and caregiver will see at home, or the student(s) will see in school if used to supplement in-person instruction). This is the page you'll see when you click on that REEL box on the main SOLS page. To start creating a REEL, select Primary or Secondary, then click next. For this example, we'll use Primary:

8. Once you have selected your theme, you'll choose the strand. This will be pre-determined by the Strand Selection Guide that you filled out prior to creating the REEL. You can also do a quick determination of the strand by clicking the drop-down of each strand (Strand B example below) and reading the information there:

- **Primary**
 - Language: Identifying nouns; labeling nouns; sorting pictures of items by category; ordering sequences; and describing three-part picture sequences
 - Functional Academics: Drawing lines and shapes; drawing pictures
 - Natural Communication: Requesting in a variety of ways
 - Engaging in Diverse Activities: Following play directions
- **Secondary**
 - Language: Learning to identify and label pictures of nouns; identifying icons from a picture schedule; grouping pictures of items by name; understanding and describing 3-part picture sequences; and requesting using words and phrases
 - Functional Academics: Making marks with a pen; tracing lines, shapes, and name; and copying name




