Navigating Through Themes First!


- 1. Once you've logged-in to the STAR Media Center and clicked on the Themes First! box, you can freely navigate through the Themes First! section of the website.
- 2. The Themes First! main page includes three boxes: the Current Theme Unit (updated monthly!), Active Theme Unites (a few recent units that are still active and useable by teachers), and Upcoming Theme Units (to help plan for upcoming months of instruction).







- 3. Current Theme Unit If you click on the Current Theme Unit, it will take you to page with several boxes that include information, resources, and activities to support students' generalization and learning including (example, as this is updated periodically):
 - a. Instruction and Alignment Chart
 - b. Classroom Customization Materials
 - c. Monthly Calendar and Unit Enrichment
 - d. Circle Activities
 - e. Group Activities
 - f. Vocabulary
 - g. Movement
 - h. Independent Work English Language Arts
 - i. Independent Work Math
 - j. Independent Work Fine Motor
 - k. Archived ELA and Math Independent Work Activities



- 4. Once you are on the Current Theme Unit page, you will be able to select each box to view and use resources to support your classroom. As an example, let's think about a student who is working on academic lessons at level 2 in the STAR Program and that student needs to start ELA Independent Work.
 - a. Click on the "Independent Work English Language Arts" box:



b. Once on the "Independent Work – English Language Arts" page, scroll to the resources near the bottom and pick an activity that would be appropriate for your student – in this case, either a worksheet or a file folder (level 2 is circled as the example):


