



Group Activity: Game – Build a Flower Game

Objective:

This activity reinforces independence and listening skills as students complete this identification and matching task.

Materials:

- Flower game board (provided)
 - Flower parts (provided)
 - Spinner board and arrow (provided)
 - Brad clip (1)
 - Velcro
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Duration: 10 to 15 minutes

Preparation:

1. Print and laminate the flower game board (1 per student).
2. Print, laminate, and cut out:
 - a. Flower parts (1 set per student)
 - b. Spinner board and arrow on heavy paper (1 of each for the entire class)
3. Add velcro to:
 - a. The back of each flower part
 - b. Each corresponding blank area on the game boards
4. Made a model of the completed flower game board with items.
5. Distribute to each student:
 - a. Game board
 - b. Flower parts
6. Assemble the spinner board and arrow by attaching the arrow to the board with a brad clip.



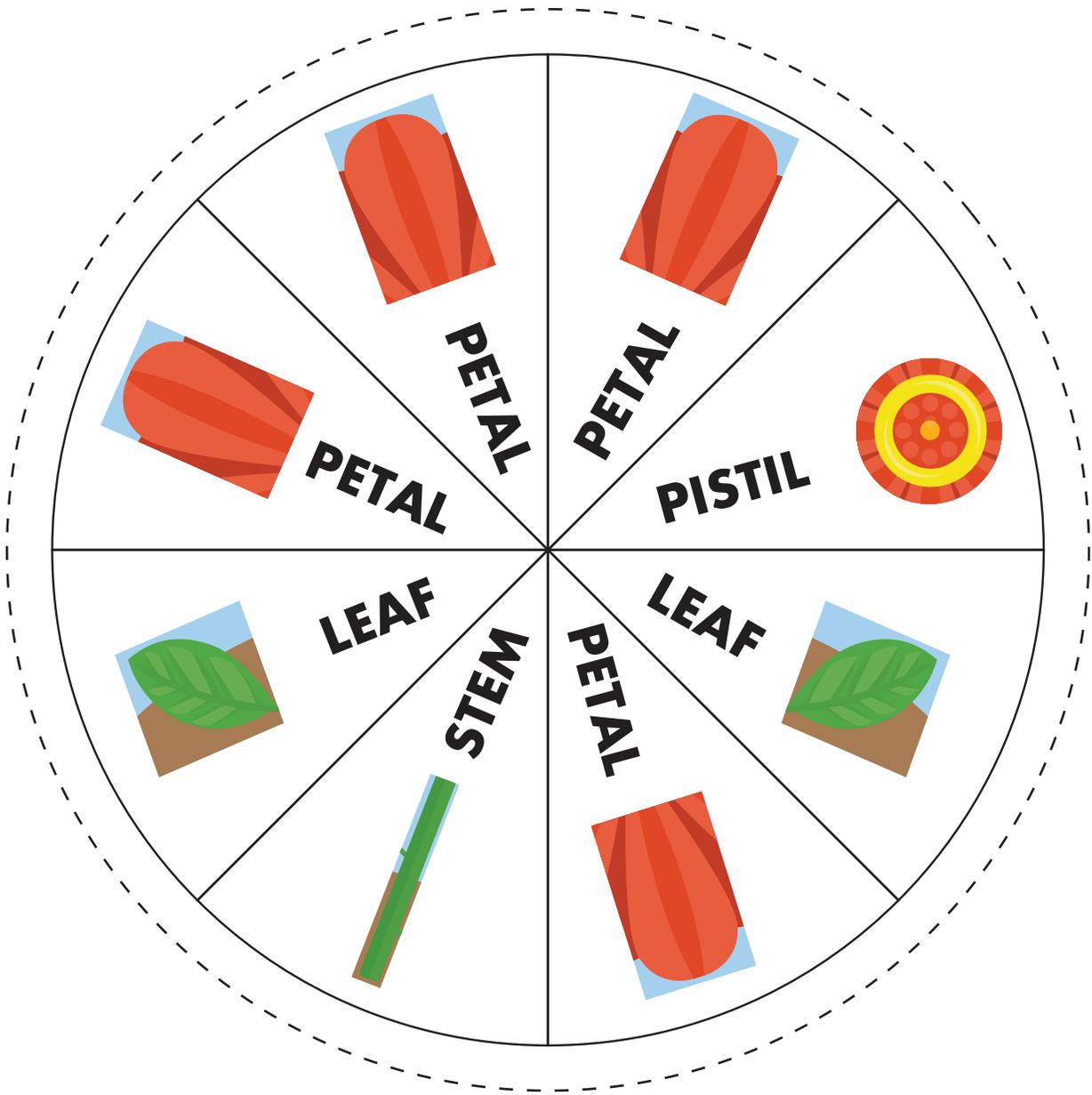
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Activity Script:

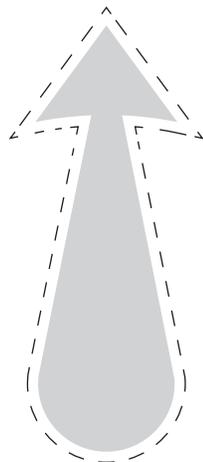
We recommend using the following verbal cues as you model each step.

1. **“Today we’re going to play a game of building a flower.”**
[Indicate your finished model and the game board in front of each student.]
2. **“We’re going to start by using this spinner. I’ll go first. Watch me do it and then we’ll take turns.”**
[Demonstrate using the spinner. Find the flower part you landed on and place it on your demonstration game board.]
3. **“Now let’s start the game. I’ll pick someone to go first and then we’ll go around in a circle.”**
[Choose a student to go first. Assist them in identifying the flower part, locating it, and placing it on their game board.]
4. **“If your spin lands on a flower part that you don’t need, we’ll skip to the next student.”**
[Explain to students that the goal of the game is to get all the flower parts for the game board.]
5. **“Who has a complete flower picture?”**
[The game is over either when the first person has “made” a complete flower picture or everyone has finished.]
