It's Spring offers students original lessons and engaging activities to guide students on a springtime journey of plants, animals, and climate. Group activities, independent work, art, science, and cooking lessons strengthen writing, math, and reading proficiency while reinforcing listening and social skills. Games, songs, life skills, and circle exercises guide students toward a greater understanding of seasonal change through hands-on curriculum catered to their individual learning levels.

All lessons throughout the theme address a diverse range of student skill levels. As students work through the *It's Spring* unit, they gain confidence, build social skills, and learn fun, fresh ways to experience this season of renewal.
